- Home baking

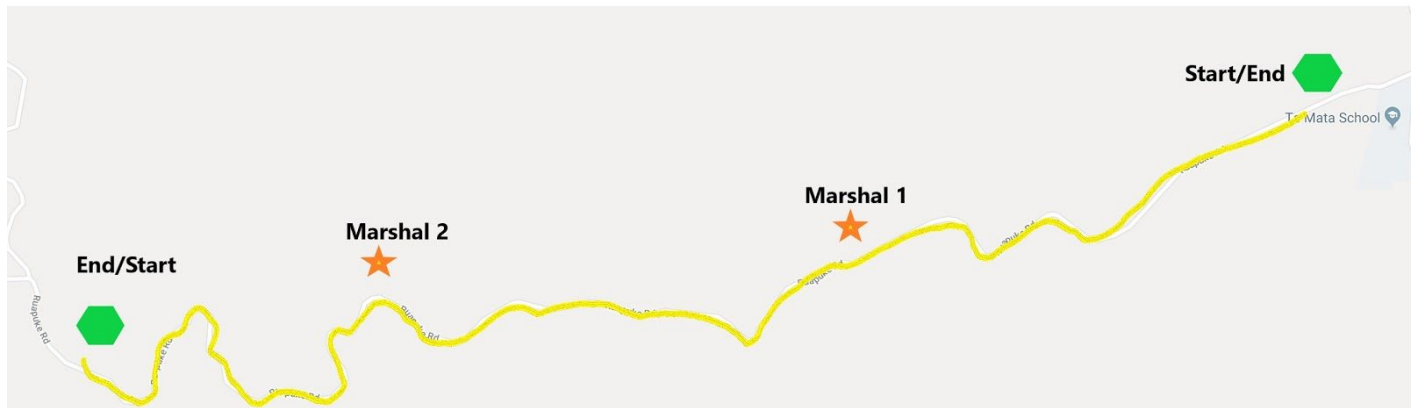


The club pays an honorarium to the school (\$500) to use the field and facilities and if we supply 2 marshalls for the day. Also they will be buying the food we have available throughout the day.
